BEIRUT ART FAIR 2019

Following a steady decade of growth, **BEIRUT ART FAIR 2019** (18 to 22 September 2019) proved **the most successful edition** of the fair to date. For its 10-year anniversary, the fair surpassed the records it had previously set, not only in terms of attendance numbers but also in terms of artistic excellency. **BEIRUT ART FAIR's sales figures** moreover set a new benchmark, with **90% of exhibiting galleries reporting significant acquisitions** by local and international collectors.

The fair was more international than ever, featuring galleries from 18 countries, and artists from 40 nationalities. It also welcomed a large number of personalities from the international art world, including around 2,000 foreign collectors as well as representatives from the world's most distinguished arts and culture institutions.

SELECTION COMMITTEE



Olivia Bourrat is the Deputy Director of the Curatorial Department at the Louvre Abu Dhabi. She is a French national heritage curator who studied Art History at the Ecole du Louvre and completed two Masters in Modern Literature and Art History at the Sorbonne (Paris IV) before following doctoral studies at the EHESS (School of Advanced Studies in Social Sciences land fulfilling the INP's training program (National Heritage Institute) in 2006 and 2007. After leaving INP, she was appointed Curator of Historic Monuments for the Rhône-Alpes' region and then joined in 2010 the musée du quai Branly as Head of the Preservation, Conservation and Analysis team. In this capacity she organised international symposiums to promote research programs conducted on the museum's collections by her team. She has also taught the course on «taste and collections History» at the INP since 2012 and has participated in the conception of different temporary exhibitions.



Jean-Marc Decrop is an expert specialized in Chinese contemporary art, and has contributed to its discovery abroad.

From 1999 to 2007, he was the partner & artistic advisor of the Loft gallery in Paris, where he produced several monographic exhibitions of the main contemporary Chinese artists and thanks to which he made numerous loans to museums. At the same time. he also carried out exhibitions in 11 museums or foundations for which he wrote catalogs. Major collector, he helps many European collections to be constituted. He later enlarged his scope to other emerging art scenes, especially Indonesia, Pakistan and Middle East. He is a shareholder in the Dubai gallery IVDE and was the one who introduced artist Hassan Sharif to that gallery. Since 2010 he had been one of the major collectors of Hassan Sharif and his collection include some of Sharif's major artworks from the 80's.



Tamara Inja Jaber is an art advisor working for prominent Arab collectors and government institutions.

Based in Dubai since 2004, Tamara promotes Lebanese artists and their work in the Gulf region.

In 2008, she curated "Lebanese Stories", a remarkable exhibition showcasing the works of modern and contemporary Lebanese artists at the Dubai International Financial Centre.

In 2010, she co-curated in Beirut "Pieces for a Museum", a retrospective celebrating the renowned and timeless works of Paul Guiragossian and Chafic Abboud.

A fierce art advocate, Tamara thrives to create, through art, a bridge between her country of origin, Lebanon, and the Arab world.



Lyne Sneige is currently the director of the Arts & Culture Program at the Middle East Institute (MEI) in Washington, D.C. Before joining MEI, Sneige was deputy director Lebanon and regional projects manager for Arts and Culture for the Middle East at the British Council operating out of Beirut. Sneige spearheaded several initiatives such as the Creative Economy and Cultural Leadership agendas in the region, and is a strong advocate of the important role that artists play in their societies, and a main contributor to changing perceptions of the cultural sector in the Middle East as an important conduit to social and economic change.

Sneige is a Salzburg Global Seminar fellow, a nominator to the Art Jameel Prize, an international award for contemporary art and design inspired by Islamic tradition organized in collaboration with the Victoria and Albert Museum in London, a nominator to the newly established Agha Khan Music Awards and an adviser to the educational and outreach program of the Beirut Museum of Art (BeMA) that is set to open in 2023.



Marie-Ann Yemsi is an independent art consultant and curator, born in Germany to German and Cameroonian parents.

In 2005, she founded her own agency, Agent Créatif(s), which has developed a renowned expertise in cultural production and art consulting with a focus on emerging artists and artistic scenes in Africa and its Diasporas.

She has been the curator at several international exhibitions, including "African Odysseys" at the Brass Cultural Center (Brussels) in 2015, "The Days that Comes" at the Galerie des Galeries (Paris) in 2017 and "A Silent Lines, Lives Here" at the Palais de Tokyo (Paris) in 2018.

She was the Artistic Director of "Afrotopia", the 11th edition of the Rencontres de Bamako, African Biennale of Photography in Mali (Dec 2017 – Jan 2018).

"A Tribute to Lebanon - Liban: Le Voyage"



"A Tribute to Lebanon" explored Western creations inspired by Lebanon, from the eighteenth century to the present day, through artworks and historical objects from the eclectic and fascinating collection of Philippe Jabre.

Artworks included historical Orientalist paintings of Lebanon's Mountain and main cities, Beirut and Tripoli, as well as rare works by twentieth-century major artists: many treasures have been revealed for the first time, with, among others, pieces by Andy Warhol, David Hockney, and nineteen-eighties Lebanese-wartime paintings by A.R. Penck and photographs by Don McCullin.

This exhibition conceived of Lebanon as a spirit, an attitude, unlimited by time or space, and a vehicle for timeless values.

LEBANON MODERN!
"Unexpected Trove—The Unseen Works of Hussein Madi"



This exhibition put the spotlight on celebrated Lebanese artist Hussein Madi's (b. 1938) first years in Rome, which saw him steer his artistic practice in the direction that characterizes him today, but also produce a so-far never exhibited, and indeed unexpected, series of bright, figurative Italian scenes.

During his first Roman years, Madi notably developed his own rules of abstraction, drawing simultaneously from his Oriental roots, Islamic art, and Western modes of artistic expression. In parallel to this well-known evolution, between 1964 and 1970, Madi produced an exceptional ensemble of close to fifty Italian scenes, a collection, assumed lost for more than three decades, that only recently resurfaced serendipitously.

CINE BOX - Video Art Program "The Sensitive Sea"



The video art program "The Sensitive Sea" is born out of a visual dialogue of the Lebanese and Western scenes around a common theme, the Sea, a bridge linking two cultures across the Mediterranean. The Sea has lured artists since Antiquity: between terror and fascination, it is simultaneously a vehicle for anxieties and hopes. The sea, and water more generally, are in both Western and Oriental literature tightly linked to ideas of memory and metamorphosis.

The selected artists propose a reflection around the multiple stakes carried by the Sea, be they political, economic or cultural. "The Sensitive Sea" highlights the sea as a contemporary artistic motif, as well as the many ways to approach it.

The debates focussed on the subject of **modern and contemporary art from the MENA** region, aiming to enrich our understanding of it, from a historical, theoretical and critical perspective, to examine its impact and brainstorm its possible futures.

The series of exchanges covered topics such as the making of the artist, the importance of art in telling an alternative story of the region, artistic scenes' effect on their environment, and financial challenges faced by regional museums today.

Celebrated British war photographer **Don McCullin also discussed his work in Beirut** in the nineteen-eighties, and **a roundtable on Orientalist art** was the occasion of a trip back in time.

The outcome reflected each kid's character and the choices/letters he picked during the workshop. This opportunity was a tool to make Arabic calligraphy a fluid form expression in their minds.

Then **Haya Khouri** organized a workshop to let children discover how **recycling** can be used in the process of product making in art.

BEIRUT ART WEEK

The fair's main satellite event, **BEIRUT ART WEEK (17 to 24 September 2019)** electrified the Lebanese capital by offering a journey of exclusive artistic experiences throughout the city.

This immersive multidisciplinary event invites to explore and celebrate, and to giving oneself to the frenetic pace of Lebanese conviviality, appetite for discovery, and sense of celebration.

BEIRUT ART WEEK was inaugurated on 17 September at 6 pm in front of Hotel Le Gray, where Lebanese-Senegalese artist Hady Sy unveiled his monumental sculpture Wall of Hope, standing at the infamous green line separating East and West Beirut and where one of Beirut's gates once stood. All along the promenade in downtown Beirut, visitors will discover and re-discover Lebanese architecture and a series of monumental sculptures exhibited throughout downtown Beirut.













Visitors will continue to the "off/site" exhibition, which will gather more than 50 independent artists from Lebanon and the region in the Lobby & Atrium of Hotel Le Gray.

The journey then unfolded with, among many other events, a live performance by Michel Abboud on the terrace of Opera Gallery, while Belvedere Art Space will offer "A Journey Into Contemporary African Art" in the presence of the artists, and, in an abandoned factory in the Bourj Hammoud district, South Border Gallery opened the doors of the exhibition "Study for a Soap" with a South American evening, transforming the space with exceptional artworks and music.

VIP PROGRAM

Numerous museums, private collections and Lebanese foundations opened their doors to VIPs in the framework of extraordinary and confidential visits. These artistic excursions were punctuated with convivial moments, dinners and unforgettable evenings which characterize the Land of the Cedars.

The **Sursock Museum** held an exclusive viewing of the exhibition "Baalbek, Archives of an Eternity", retracing the history of this eight-millennial site, and a tour of its permanent collection of Lebanese art, while the **Beirut Art Center** hosted a private tour of the contemporary art exhibition "How to Reappear", and **Dar El Nimer** welcomed VIPs to the exhibition "La Mer Patrie", featuring 1980s photographs of Palestinian life in Beirut by Fouad Elkoury and Jeremy Peacock.

The Art Galleries of the American University of Beirut hosted VIPs to discover "The Permanent Collection" which included a wide variety of works from some of the major figures of Lebanese art, as well as the exhibition "CUT/GASH/SLASH - Adachi Masao – A Militant Theory of Landscape", celebrating the art and movies of this leading figure of Japanese New Wave cinema with strong ties to Lebanon. Mina Image Centre gave tour of Taysir Basniji's "Sand Comes Through the Window".

Looking to the future, **MACAM** investigated the human interaction with virtual reality and the digital. Also opening their doors for private tours were the **A.MUSE.UM**, dedicated to works by noted Lebanese artist Nadim Karam as well as the **Ramzi and Saeda Dalloul Foundation**, boasting more than 4,000 artworks from North Africa and the Middle East, and **Philippe Jabre**, with a collection spanning three centuries of art and a special exhibition of celebrated British photographer **Don McCullin**.

Then, thanks to our partners **Lebanese Talents/Banzy Gallery**, **A.MUSE.UM** of Nadim Karam, **The Gathering**, **Gibran Tueni Foundation** & the **organizers of the exhibition of Fadia Ahmad** at Beit Beirut, VIPs enjoyed wonderful receptions, exhibitions & parties.

The BEIRUT ART FAIR VIP Pass also granted an entrance for two people at Lazy B, one of Lebanon's most beautiful, and peaceful, beaches.






